2022 Calgary Transit Service Review

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The Project

Project Background

Since Calgary is a growing and evolving city, travel patterns are constantly changing. With new developments, schools, employment centers and demographic change in communities, some bus routes no longer meet customer needs. Therefore, periodic reviews of the bus network are required.

Project Overview

Calgary Transit is reviewing existing bus services to develop a more effective and efficient bus service network for Calgarians. The goal of this review is to implement a revised network to improve service for newer communities that do not have transit service, or only have transit service during certain times of the day.

The South Macleod Transit Service Review proposed changes to 9 routes in the City's Southwest and Southeast.

The existing bus service network will be revised based on the following objectives:

- To provide routes that are more direct and easier to understand;
- To reduce travel time;
- To operate more frequently with a longer span of service where possible
- To provide better service to key destinations;
- To reduce duplication of service.
- To increase ridership;
- Improve service hour productivity.

Engagement Purpose

The purpose of the engagement was to raise awareness and receive feedback on the proposed route changes to ensure that they support a positive transit experience for riders, and so that Calgary Transit can share information as a way of effectively managing this change and supporting riders in using the new routes.



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Engagement Overview

In August and September of 2022, Calgary Transit conducted engagement on the South Macleod Transit Service Review, engaging Calgarians on proposed route changes. The goal was to provide transit riders with the opportunity to learn about the proposed changes and to gather their input to ensure that the new or modified proposed bus routes would meet their needs.

Over the course of the full engagement period, Calgary Transit held an online survey, which allowed transit users to review the proposed changes, and submit feedback on whether the new network would meet their needs.

Engagement Promotion

The engagement promotion and outreach were designed to reach a broad audience of Calgarians including Ward Councillors, current transit riders, community association, the Calgary Board of Education, the Calgary Catholic School District, as well as potential transit riders living, and working in south Calgary.

Promotions for the online engagement included printed signage, social media campaigns, online information on the Calgary Transit website as well as mobile applications and the City of Calgary's engage portal.



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Participation and Technique Summary

1. Online Engagement Portal

From August 19 to September 9, 2022, the project's engagement site on the Calgary Transit's Website and received 6934 views. In total there were 1409 responses to the survey.

The website provided some project background and listed the routes that were proposed to be changed as part of the project. Below this, there was a section for each route that was proposed to be changed. Each section displayed a "What Happened To" map, as well as a map of the new route the customer would likely use in its stead. Each section additionally provided a brief description of the route change and listed the likely impact that the current route user would encounter.

At the bottom of the page, participants were invited to provide their input on the new routes through Calgary Transit's online survey.

Participants were asked about demographic information, route-specific feedback, as well as to rank of the importance of five factors pertaining to travel on transit. (Specific Questions below)

Engagement Questions

Through the online survey, participants were asked:

1. Please tell us Your Postal Code.

2. What Community do you live in?

3. What ROUTE are you commenting on?

4. Please RANK the following in importance to you, with 1 being the most important and 5 being the least:

- Frequency (How often the bus comes.)
- Service Span (The time of day a route starts and ends.)
- Walkability (How far/easy is the walk to the bus/train?)
- Do I Need A Transfer (Do I need to get on another bus/train?)
- Travel Time (How long it takes me to get to where I want to go)

5. When thinking about how you answered question 4, how does this route MEET or NOT MEET, your travel needs?



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Demographic Data: Who Participated

Below is a summary of input received in the online survey that specifically pertained to community.

For phase one of the engagement, 28 communities were represented. Additionally, there was 1 mixed community submitted. It has been listed separately below.

Which Themes Developed - Codes Emerging from Input

From the online data, several codes were identified and used to code the input and determine how frequently certain themes arose in the data. Codes identified were:

- Comfort - Negative
- Comfort – Positive
- Coverage – better/goes to more places / goes where I need to go
- Coverage – worse / not going where it used to go/ where it should go
- Do not change route/ keep as is
- Does not meet my travel needs
- Frequency – negative/worse/ less frequent/ capacity concerns (crowded)
- Frequency – positive/improved/ more frequent
- Importance of Connections Lining Up – General
- Length – longer/ adds time/ slower to destination
- Length – shorter/ reduces time/ faster to destination
- Meets my travel needs
- Number of stops – negative/worse
- Safety concerns – negative
- School



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Size of bus – negative
Span of service -Better
Span of Service – worse
Transfers – negative/ more, less direct
Transfers – positive/ fewer, more direct
Waiting time – negative/worse/longer/more
Waiting time – positive/improved/shorter
Walkability – negative

Next steps

The input collected from the online survey has been analyzed and reviewed in the creation of this report.

Feedback received was considered and incorporated into revisions and adjustments to the plan.



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Summary of Input

Route-specific Summaries

This section will discuss the feedback received on the South Macleod Transit Service Review's proposed route changes. Feedback is summarized by route. Each section includes the results of both a ranking exercise as well as a high-level summary of the comments received by Calgary Transit through the online survey.

Summaries are provided below for feedback on all routes that are either new or changed under the newly proposed plan.

All feedback received by Calgary Transit was reviewed by Calgary Transit staff and were taken into consideration when further refining and finalizing the City's Transit Plan.

We received many comments on the new proposed routes, as well as comments on existing routes. They are all presented in numerical order for ease of reference. The new proposed routes do not overlap identically with the existing routes.

All comments can be found as they were submitted in the Verbatim Responses section.




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Route 11/12

The existing Route 11/12 would be modified by realigning the route from Midpark DR SE to Midpark BV SE.



Findings from the ranking exercise show that for Routes 11/12, respondents most often ranked frequency of the busses as either the most important (62%) or the second most important (23%) consideration when taking public transit. Service Span was also considered important, with 10% of respondents ranking it first, but 33% of respondents ranking it second.

Many respondents found that the proposed modified route would still meet their travel needs.

“Although I have a stop in from of my home currently, the new proposed route is acceptable for our transit needs” (Midnapore resident)

“This route will meet my travel needs” (Midnapore resident)

“I enjoy the new proposed routing. Thank you!” (Shawnessy resident)

“The route 12 is a full fill my needs, otherwise, the other hand the number 11 too, but take more time and sometimes on weekend the did not appear at all. Both the 12 and the 11 raight now accomp[lish all my needs of transportation for my wife and for me.” (Shawnessy resident)



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In the comments, the most common theme of displeasure was with the route's span and/or frequency. This was sometimes mentioned from customers who found that the route met their needs:

"I would say that I would like to have a more frequent and larger service span for a bus route servicing Evergreen, which has a high level of ridership. I do feel that the 11/12 in communities outside of Evergreen seem to have uneven ridership, so I would like that to be considered as either under this current review or further revisions in the future." (Evergreen resident)

"Route needs to run more often and later" (Midnapore resident)

"I need more frequent services and in winter time walkability." (Midnapore resident)

Additionally, some respondents expressed displeasure with the Route's move from Midpark DR to Midpark BV:

"Bus route is proposed to move off my street and will be a 5 minute walk away which reduces convenience and access." (Midnapore resident)

"Prefer current 11 and 12 routing, but if change is necessary, keep 11 routing the same on Midpark Dr., and change 12 routing to proposed route on Midpark Blvd. With this recommendation, both Midpark Dr. and Midpark Blvd. are supported equally/fairly, with minimal impact to walking distance for residents near Midpark Dr. With adjustment of route 52 away from Midnapore, my recommendation keeps things reasonably similar to existing service." (Midnapore resident)

"Proposed route decrease service for me, increases the amount of walking time which also impacts overall travel time and is very inconvenient in winter. Service is barely adequate as it is and this makes it much worse. Completely unacceptable." (Midnapore resident)

What We Did

- No Change made to Plan

Key Factors for Decision-Making

- Route 11/12 modification is being made to support the removal of the route 15, a change that is crucial to allowing the plan to provide transit service to communities that have limited service, or do not yet have it.
- Most residents on Midpark DR are within 400m of bus stops on Midpark BV
- Low existing ridership on Midpark BV
- Consolidating service onto the larger road (Midpark BV) helps drive ridership for Routes 11 and 12.
- Increasing the service span for Routes 11 and 12 is outside the scope of the project.




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Route 78 (includes Route 178)

The existing Route 78 was modified to provide service to Belmont and Yorkville. It would also be removed from Sun Valley BV SE in order to provide all-day two-way service on Sunmills DR. Finally, Peak frequency improved from 25 minutes to 18 minutes. Route 178 is removed.



For almost half of respondents (43%), frequency of the busses on this route was the most important consideration, with another third (33%) ranking it second-most important. Walkability came in second place overall, with 27% ranking that aspect most important and 17% ranking that aspect second-most important. Travel time came in third with about 20% of respondents ranking it as their first or second most importance factor.

Route 78 was one of the routes that was most commented on during the online survey. The route change affects existing customers from Chaparral and Sundance, as well as new potential customers on the west side of Macleod TR. As such, half of these respondents for Route 78 were existing customers, and the other half were potential customers from west of Macleod TR.

Many from Chaparral who commented on this route referenced that it would increase their trip time to/from Somerset-Bridlewood Station:

Not exactly meeting travel needs. It will increase travel times and reduce travel options. If you cancel the 178 you should increase frequency of 78 during peak hours to compensate. Waiting at Somerset for 30 min for the 78 when right now it is 15 minutes for either the 78 or 178 is not making travel better. Also did you consider



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where people work or are going? For example if a lot of people work downtown in the area then having direct trips during peak hours to downtown would increase ridership and convenience.” (Chaparral resident)

“This route will increase the time traveled so does not meet my needs.” (Chaparral resident)

“Currently, the route is very quick to arrive at the Somerset station. The proposed changes will add too much time and I will drive instead.” (Chaparral resident)

Another major theme that arose was students travelling to Centennial High School from Chaparral:

“Getting from Chaparral to Centennial High School in Sundance will take an unknown amount of time longer. Centennial is the designated public high school for Chaparral and I would expect a lot of ridership in the morning and the afternoon. Also, the 78 used to make a quick detour to Centennial high school in the morning before heading to the train and now this will not be possible.” (Chaparral resident)

The new proposed route is going to cause huge problems for my family. We rely on the present route to get my children to and from school everyday. Without it, I do not know what we will do. I am a teacher whose school hours do not match those of my children so I can't drive them to and from school each day. This worries me. (Chaparral resident)

It makes for a very long bus ride for my son to get home from high school in sundance to chaparral. If the purpose of public transit is to alleviate congestion on the roads, this proposed route won't do it. I will still continue to take him to school and pick him up from the high school as I don't want him spending that long in transit. (Chaparral resident)

Some residents were opposed to the removal of the Route 178, as its removal resulted in fewer options being available traveling to/from Chaparral:

This route shouldn't be removed because it's so convenient for two buses. There's a lot of people in this neighborhood and when i get off for the train sometimes i can't even get on the bus. And with this now i'll have to wait longer for another 78??? This one was convenient because if you missed the 78 you got onto the 178 and made it home in time to spend with your fam.

“Eliminating route 178 and only having one way service for 78 is ridiculous. This bus is currently overflowing with students in the school year and will now only get worse. The only solution should be to add another bus/route to accommodate other areas. The 178 route should not be changed.”

On the West side of Macleod TR, many respondents approved of the route 78 change, as it provided service where none currently existed:

“I currently live in belmont. Takes me 30 minutes to walk to silverado bus stop near sobeys. Any bus stop near belmont would save me time to get to work. I also have a toddler child with whom i have to walk for day care. Winter conditions will make it very difficult.” (Belmont resident)



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"It's a new service to our community and bus service is very much needed in our community as the community is full of young families and it will be much appreciated if this proposed route starts." (Belmont resident)

"The route 78 will meet my requirement. I usually walk till Silverado everyday to get bus to Somerset and then I take train to go to my office. I do follow the same route when I come back from office. I walk from Silverado to Belmont every day. If route 78 will be active then k will save 1 hour of my travel time everyday." (Belmont resident)

However, some respondents on the west side of Macleod TR found that the proposed route did not travel far enough into their community, meaning that they would still have to walk relatively far to transit service:

"We are in Yorkville community, this route will enable our access to train lot easier. And if possible, we would love the bus to go through Yorkville boulevard which makes journey to downtown for work and saves us some struggle looking for park and rides. Please consider this request 🙏"

"The route need to be around the Belmont community, then people can get close access to bus station, not only from the main way that is plane."

"For community members like myself in Yorkville, who live far West in the community down 194 road, we would need to walk to the nearest bus route which would take 15-20 mins (depending on your walking abilities). Too far especially in winter when it's -30. It would help if the bus went into Yorkville Ave and out through Yorkville blvd and down 194 road to sheriff king road to continue on the proposed bus path, which would have no more than 2 mins of driving time. Thanks."

What We Did


- Route 78 trip variant was added to travel from Chaparral directly to Centennial in the AM, and from Centennial directly to Chaparral in the PM.

Key Factors for Decision-Making

- Travel time between Chaparral and Somerset is estimated to increase by about 4 minutes.
- While the Route 178 is convenient by providing a additional travel option, it has had low ridership, and most communities do not have access to a additional peak-only service.
- Adding frequency to Route 78 distributes frequency improvements in a reliable way, as Route 78 and 178 trips are not evenly spaced throughout the community.
- Extending the Route 78 further into communities west of Macleod would result in disproportionately impacting the travel time of Chaparral.

Route 102 (includes Routes 15 & 402)

Route 102 is a new route, proposed to replace the Route 402 in Silverado, and the Route 15 in Millrise and Shawnessy.



When looking at the ranking exercise results for Route 102, Frequency was the most important consideration, with close to half of respondent ranking it (47%). Travel Time had only 23% of respondents rank it as their most important consideration. Walkability came close to this, with 19% of respondents ranking it as their most important consideration.

Feedback on this route often pertained to the replacement of two-way service in Millrise/Shawnessy with a one-way loop. Some respondents thought it would be less convenient to reach Fish Creek Station:

Route 102 will work for me less well than current Route 15. Increased frequency through Millrise will only run one way, because the proposal cancels service in the other direction. This means that living in Millrise, I'll be disconnected from Fish Creek station, which is closer to downtown than Shawnessy. Walking to either Shawnessy or Fish Creek station will become faster than waiting for the local bus, even with its faster frequencies, so my journey time between (for example) Millrise and UofC will go up more. I think that making



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this route a one-way loop will make every transit user in the Millrise/Shawnessy area less connected and push us further towards car dependency. That's why I'm strongly against the change. (Millrise Resident))

When choosing whether to take transit or drive to the station when heading north from the area, bus frequency on route 15 already pushes me to drive almost every time. But disconnecting it from Fish Creek station, which is closest to our community and closer to downtown, would discourage me even more. The proposed changes won't help car dependency in Millrise at all, and will just make it last longer in time. Making the city more accessible by transit and getting more people onto transit is important and needs to be the goal, and the proposed changes don't match that goal.

"It does not meet my needs because I need to be able to access fish creek station. I also need the ability to travel in both directions. The change to one way would impact this for me." (Millrise resident)"

As the new Route 102 removes service from a portion of Millrise BV with a Senior's facility, there was concern with walkability:

"It does not meet my needs. It skips a few stops where a lot of people get on/off the bus for the Millrise Seniors Center." (Millrise resident)

"i take this bus too and from work as well as my niece to the park I am disable and I live in the area as a seniors home a nursing home and a daycare where people have limited mobility to remove our stop would be a travesty it is a long walk to the train station and also the sobeys for me and a lot of other people." (Millrise Resident)

What We Did

- No Change made to Plan

Key Factors for Decision-Making

- Shortening the route servicing Millrise allows Calgary Transit to improve the off-peak frequency in Millrise. Currently it only has 60-minute frequency.
- New route provides connection to Shawnessy LRT Station, which has the same connections as Fish Creek Station.
- From north Millrise, it is estimated the travel time difference to Fish Creek Station will be about 5 minutes. While adding two-way service would benefit these customers, it would lengthen the route and augment the headways for all other customers.
- There is Low ridership on Millrise BV SW. While extending the route to Millrise BV would benefit seniors on the road, it would lengthen the route and decrease the headways for all other customers. The Senior facility is also within less than 200m of transit service on James Mckevitt RD SW.




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Route 167 (includes Route 168)

Route 167 will be realigned to travel on Macleod TR, instead of Sun Valley BV to reduce coverage duplication. Peak frequency is increased to every 15 minutes, and midday and weekend service is added. Route 168 is discontinued.



Findings from the ranking exercise show that for this route, respondents most often ranked Frequency and Service Span as the most important (40%) consideration when taking public transit.

Route 167 was the route that was most commented on in the survey. Most respondents were positive about the change, as it provided a service expansion that has been requested for many years:

“The addition of midday and weekend service is very welcome and necessary for those who depend on public transportation in Legacy/Walden; I would also like to suggest extending the service span longer into the evening



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for those who need to commute from work past 7 PM, so that it is comparable to other routes in this area (most routes span to midnight).” (Legacy resident)

“There is currently no service on weekends, during the afternoons or evenings past 6pm or holidays. The only time there is bus service is every half hour during morning and afternoon rush hour. Not everyone can drive and the closest next bus service is over 30 min walk away.” (Legacy resident)

“The 167 bus doesn’t come mid-day on weekdays, or at all on weekends. That creates a big problem for me. During the hours it currently operates, it comes often enough. It is very handy for me to get to the nearby bus stop from my home. It is handy that this bus goes to the train station.” (Legacy resident)

“I hope the proposed changes on Route 167 as it’s been really FRUSTRATING not have any bus services on the weekends or middays, especially for those who don’t drive. It’s very frustrating to be stuck in the area o probably get an Uber in order to leave the zone any days of the weekend or middays. I’m very looking forward to see it. Please go ahead.” (Walden resident)

The route change did provide concern to Legacy students trying to reach Centennial High School and Chaparral Students trying to reach All Saints High School. Both connections would be removed with the Route 168:

The route does not meet my needs. Would have to walk a fare amount in order to get a bus to where I need to go. There would no longer be an easy direct route from chaparral drive to All Saints High School in Legacy. (Legacy resident)

Our child is starting at All Saints high school this year and needs to take a bus to and from Chaparral. Currently the 168 stops within a 5 to 10 min walk from the house and drops him off at or near the School. Once this change and the change to the 78 bus route there will be no bus stops that will get our child to the high school without at least a 330 min walk to the closest stop and then they will need to change buses in Walden. (Chaparral resident)

You've extended the transit ride quite substantially for kids who go to Centennial High School as well as for people who work in Sundance. The 168 and 167 routes provided a direct bus route from Chaparral and Walden to Sundance via the blvds. For those of us in Chaparral, the only option will be the 78 and it seems quite a long, roundabout route, especially now that it will go through the newer communities and is only one way. The 78 also stops at the train station before it gets to Sundance and vice versa to Chaparral - how long will it be sitting there before it continues on? The 168 and 167 routes avoided that when it went along the blvds. (Legacy resident)

“The removal of Route 168 will not allow me to get to Centennial high school, as I have no ther way of transportation.” (Walden resident)



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Most negative responses centered around the desire for greater span or frequency with the proposed service:

*“Need to extend last hour of the bus at weekdays at 9pm and hoping have route on the weekends”
(Legacy resident)*

“It doesn’t work for me. I take C-Train daily and if I wait for the bus then it will take me forever to reach the train station. I wish there’s more bus that can go directly from Legacy to Somerset station.” (Legacy resident)

“This route + 168 does not allow for an evening life or a weekend life due to the fact you don’t run either line past 7pm during the week even if you left one bus on until 11pm at least especially for anybody working late shifts, retail or wanting to stay out for dinner after work they can without thinking i can’t because my last bus leaves the station at 630pm. And as for the weekends i notice many people in the condos walking to the save on foods location to pick up the 78 and during winter that sucks so to have at least one route on the weekends would be a big help every 30 minutes or so, would help those, with work, appointments anybody wanting to just get out of the neighborhood and anyone at the front end that doesn’t drive that wants to go to bed bath and beyond or Sobeys to get groceries but doesn’t wish to walk. “ (Walden resident)

What We Did

- School Route 867 modified to provide connection between Chaparral and All Saints High School
- Route 167 trip variant was added to travel from Legacy/Walden directly to Centennial in the AM.

Key Factors for Decision-Making

- Extending service span in Walden/Legacy was a priority of the plan, as this area has not seen a service span improvement for many years.
- It is beyond the scope of this project to extend the service span beyond what is provided (midday and weekend provided).
- Calgary Transit does have future plans to extend the service span in Legacy/Walden but does not have the resources to do this right now.




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Route 194 (includes Route 444)

Route 194 is a new route that will replace Route 444. It will be extended to Wolf Willow. Where Route 444 had peak service only, the Route 194 provides midday service as well.



For respondents commenting on Route 194 or former Route 444, Frequency often ranked as the most important (44%) or the second-most important (34%) factor they consider when taking the bus. Walkability ranked second overall (27%).



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Comments on this new route were generally positive, with many respondents from Wolf Willow supporting the introduction of service to their community:

It's good to see bus service is finally coming to wolf Willow but it should have come before. We are in community for over 2 years and 8 months now. Or previous tenant cant drive , so she always has to walk up the hill even if minus 35 to take a bus. I used to give her rides all the time but this is the obot reason why she left the community. Bus service should be same as other communities. I know city had its own parameters to run the bus service but please keep asking people on regular basis how many of us need bus. Also please make service as much as possible. Thank you. (Wolf Willow resident)

Proposed route would address the walkability problem in Wolf Willow. (Wolf Willow resident)

I need this route so I can save time going to bus stop on Chaparral Valley or up the hill. Especially in winter, it makes me exhausted carrying my backpack full of books for my classes in college. (Wolf Willow resident)

Although this new route adds midday service, many respondents still requested that service periods be extended for this route:

The new route to Wolf Willow is definitely needed. However, can you extend the Span: Until 19:00 by at least another hour? (Wolf Willow resident)

Most of it but this service needs to be run on weekends too. I don't drive and stranded especially in the winter (Chaparral Valley resident)

Schedule in the morning is great, after 7 it is frustrating there is no service. Weekends are hard with no bus in Chaparral Valley. Would be nice to have transit coverage Saturdays especially. (Chaparral Valley resident)

What We Did

- No Change made to Plan

Key Factors for Decision-Making

- It is outside the scope of this project to extend service span beyond what is improved already (midday service).
- Route 194 is now the only route serving Chaparral Valley, Wolf willow and NE Walden. This will hopefully provide opportunity for further growth of the route.



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Verbatim Comments

Appendix 1 Verbatim Responses

Route 11/12:

Although I have a stop in front of my home currently, the new proposed route is acceptable for our transit needs.
It's perfect
It works pretty well. I use it very frequently as it's the only routes an okay distance from my house. My concern is how early it ends: the last bus for route 11 (weekdays) is 9:26 from Somerset so when my shifts end at 11:30, I have to take route 14 home; an entire block away, late at night. My request would be to please have the buses run longer into the night
living close to a bus stop is perfect for me since I don't drive.
Not meet
Meets my needs
I would say that I would like to have a more frequent and larger service span for a bus route servicing Evergreen, which has a high level of ridership. I do feel that the 11/12 in communities outside of Evergreen seem to have uneven ridership, so I would like that to be considered as either under this current review or further revisions in the future.
It's ok but could do better, especially during school days
Routes 11/12 connect me reasonably well to other locations in the deep SW area, but there are some ways they could work better. As the only routes serving huge chunks of Evergreen, they need a larger service span. For example, they could run until 12.30AM like route 14, with many people are still moving through the area at that time and most of Evergreen being very far from LRT and otherwise unconnected. For the same reason, higher frequencies (15/20 minutes) would be great. They would move us through the area more reliably. This would attract more riders, as they could now rely on a bus coming soon at any moment, whereas wait times of 30 minutes push most people away from the route.
Needs more frequency
bus 15 have the closest stop to my place



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This route meets my needs
The route is fine, don't change it
I just need it to come when scheduled. More often than not, it is 2-3 minutes before stop time. It seems to be that Stop 5943, with a 6:40 departure has become a 6:37 or 6:38 departure.
Same person who said Stop 5943 is early. I have an Apple phone and I can't change the time and it shows 6:37 or 6:38 when the bus drives right by me when I am about 100 feet from the stop.

I work at seton and I always get to fishcreek station at 12am from my work and there's no bus 12. Unfortunately, that leave me with no choice but I have to spend extra money on uber to take me home. Very not convenient at all. It would help me alot if you can consider my feedback, please.

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South Macleod Route Review maps are incomprehensible.
Big problems on Sunday with having the route 11 not start till much later in the day. People still have to get to work early on Sunday and sadly I am not able to do this with how these routes work.
I only need to take one bus, unfortunately if I start work at 1pm I need to leave @12 and arrive 30min early to be on time
Every 15 minutes during peak times would increase efficiency across the board and allow more flexibility in peoples schedules. It would also decrease the capacity in most buses, not allowing buildup of passengers at the stations. Fish creek station catching the 12 usually means it is quite full. I don't care about getting a seat but it's often so full people are squished trying to get on and off. Overall good bus route, minor changes near mindapore make sense.
They are fine except when transferring from Fish Creek train to route 15 bus, the bus does not wait most of the time, so then the next bus comes quite a long time later! and scheduling is not kept to close tolerances, and the clock on the Fish Creek station is not working half the time! My big beef is if there is a train delay, a lot of time goes by before the announcement finally comes!
It's OK except when transferring from train to bus, this could be improved by having the bus wait for passengers when a train had just arrived, or have the bus arrival frequency increased from every 40 minutes or so to 20 minutes. Have bus routes more easily accessible or announce the connections at train stations for people new to Calgary
It does somehow meet my needs. However, bus 11 and 12 don't run early enough on weekends and it should run more often like 14 and 15 from all the three stations, fish creek, shawnessy and Somerset. The wait time is always too long at these stations.
Bus 12 should come every 15 minutes specially during winter time. When it's every 30 minutes and you missed just 30 seconds of it you have to wait for another 30 minutes for the next bus.
I would like it if this route came more often than every 30 minutes. If I'm running late in the morning and miss my bus the next bus coming makes me late for work in the morning and I have to Uber costing me more money. In the evening when I get to the somerset bridlewood just after 5 missing this bus by a few minutes Ans I have to wait half an hour for the next one. Even if I get off at the Shawnessy station the bus is gone by then still making me have to wait half an hour. Increasing the route to every 15 minutes especially during peak times would help with this issue.

This change is absurd. Leave it alone!!!!
Route needs to run more often and later
We need enough options to get to and from the jr and high-schools in the area. There needs to be enough buses to safely transport the students without packing them in like sardines. Many times my kids were asked to wait for the next bus and this is not acceptable in high/low temperature conditions. Transit should commite to reviewing the bus loads during peak hours throughout the year and adjusting without having people complain before something is done. Please be proactive this time especially when changing routes as purposed.

I use everyday bus and train, I need my bus frecuencia and on time, also on weekend because I work on weekends early.
We need more bus 11. Kids in junior high keep getting to school late. There's a 7:06am bus 11 but it's too early for the children. We need additional 2 bus 11s between 7:15am and 7: 35am every morning.
It's not just about this 11/12, this is for all buses I take. That bring the 15,52,12,402. One of my biggest pet peeves is how the drivers see you RUNNING to catch the bus and they don't stop. But they have no issue being early or late to their stops but have no decency to help out those who depend on them. This has been an ongoing issue with transit for the time span I've lived here (16 years)
It need way higher frequency
I am unable to walk large distances and rely on transit to get to school. The bus stop I use is a minute walk from my home. If it is further it reduces my ability to get to school.
The route currently fulfills my travel needs but the proposed changes would double my walking time to the nearest bus stop
Frequency is the highest priority because as a student, I need to take transit to get to where I need to go, such as going and coming back from the university, grocery shopping, and more. Frequency is also important because of the increase in bus capacity, which allows for more comfortability and encourages others to take the system (which helps with the transit recovery). Since school started on the week of Sept 6, my bus 11 in the morning is at 100% full capacity, in which if 5 more people came on the bus, a full bus indicator would need to be used. It would help everyone if there was at least 15 minute frequency for the peak morning rush for Bus 11, along with 15 minute frequency for bus 12 for the peak evening rush.



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the busses need to be available for ages 10+ to get to and from school everyday without having to leave the house 15-30 minutes before the bus comes due to the walk. new communities need more busses and closer stops. parents are back to work full time as well as their children so if they need to leave early the children should be able to get to the bus stop within 7-10 minutes maximum. no one wants to be freezing in -40 this winter because the routes are so far and no parent wants to be late because they have to drive their children to school.

I'm taking the bus 11 at stop # 3932 to Fishcreek Lacombe Ctrain station between 7-8am, weekdays. "Frequency" doesnt meet at all in this route. Since it's a school route, a bus has to pass by 6-7 stops picking up nobody due to packed students.

Route 78:

Wish this route would go Both ways...it would be safer than having to cross at the marked cross walk at Chapala Way and Chaparral Boulevard because Chaparral Boulevard has become very busy with traffic passing thru to go to Chaparral Valley/Walden/Legacy/Wolf Willow. I liked that there were bus stops on either side of Chaparral Boulevard, it is also safer for kids going to school.

The buses are too frequent during non peak hours during the week and we do don't require a big bus during this time. The big buses are noisy and more expensive to operate and a lot of time are running empty.

It dosent run as often. Please add more buses

Wouldn't mind all bus service on Suncrest Way SE Calgary be eliminated due to noise, and empty buses all day long. Watching my tax money going by is very difficult, ridership is almost nondescript.

It appears that there has been no significant changes to the Chaparral portion. It meets my needs

I think it will ok, but I will miss the 178.

Doesn't seem to impact me, based on my location and the location of the bus stops.

It takes longer to get to my destination on the 78 then I have to get on the C-train, up to Anderson station, on to the 92 to South Trail Mall, so I opt to get on the 14 the onto the 302 to my destination.

The new route does not meet our needs as it completely missed the major road in Sundance which is Sun Valley Blvd. Most people can access this road and that's where the high school is. New route is ridiculous and
The new proposed route is going to cause huge problems for my family. We rely on the present route to get my children to and from school everyday. Without it, I do not know what we will do. I am a teacher whose school hours do not match those of my children so I can't drive them to and from school each day. This worries me.



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What you are proposing is to serve Belmont community to Chaparral route which takes long enough as it is without adding Belmont stops to it. I am against it.
The busses are often not following schedule and if you miss one it takes half an hour for the next. I have waited at my stop for nearly an hour before with no busses ever showing up because they fall off schedule in chaparral due to the higher volume of transit users then the users in sundance are left to suffer due to the combined route. I think both communities would benefit from having separate routes for both, and an overlap at somerset should they desire to go from one community to the other.
Currently meets my needs
The extension to Belmont/Yorkville does not affect me.
Right now between route 79 and 178 it meets all my travel needs to the LRT station and than home again. I take the train on Saturdays and Sundays so I need the bus outside regular rush hours and days.
It is the only route that now passes by Centennial High School from Chaparral. The duration from Chaparral to Sundance has been greatly increased with the added community stops. The needs of the kids that will be using Public Transit to get to school seem to be ignored with the upcoming changes. These changes do not seem to be an improvement to service.
Looks like it may take longer for kids taking the bus from Chaparral to get to Centennial High School in Sundance.
It would take longer to get to where I need to go, and if I took a different route, I would need to transfer buses.
It makes for a very long bus ride for my son to get home from high school in sundance to chaparral. If the purpose of public transit is to alleviate congestion on the roads, this proposed route won't do it. I will still continue to take him to school and pick him up from the high school as I don't want him spending that long in transit.
With the proposed 78 bus route along with the removal of the 178 the bus I usually take to get to school the travel time from my house to my school will be almost doubled, this would be a huge inconvenience.
This route no longer meets my requirements to go from Chaparral to Sundance. I am very disappointed with the changes you are proposing to all of the bus routes within Chaparral. You are severely limiting transit options.

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I would suggest short-turning the proposed 78 turn around via Chapala Way and Chapala Dr, with two-way service then provided on Chaparral Dr. This reduces the variability in travel time for residents in the north and south of the community.
The improved frequency and wider coverage for route 78 works well for me, as I go to Sundance often. However, taking away coverage from the Suncrest Way leg of the route with both the 78 and 178 isn't just giving that area a longer walk to transit, it's gutting their frequency as well. The 78 might run every 18 minutes rather than every 30, but every alternative in the area is running the same or going away. On Sun Valley Blvd, routes 14 and 52 will have the same frequency as before, and this leg of 167/168 is going away, so every person in this area will be less connected to every destination, especially Somerset station.
The proposed route would negatively impact my current use of transit services as I use both route 78 and 178 to commute to and from work. The elimination of route 178 would significantly lengthen the amount of time it takes me to get to somerset station, and the lengthening of route 78 would further exacerbate the problem. Although it is not clear how much longer the trip would take, it looks like it could lengthen my daily commute by an estimated 20 minutes or more, which would be quite disappointing.
Eliminate Belmont portion. It will take too long to get through Chaparral, especially for those along east side of chaparral. Route 102 should serve Belmont instead, not route 78.

The travel time from the Somerset C-train station to the Chaparral Ravine area will be a much longer time to get home because (1) the proposed new 78 Chaparral route is adding two new areas (Belmont and Yorkville) and (2) having to cross Chaparral Blvd. (a very busy blvd. where traffic with cars which are going into and coming out of Chaparral Valley, Wolf Willow, Walden and Legacy) The 178 bus route now services riders from the Chaparral Ravine area and the Chaparral Ridge area with a much shorter ride from the Somerset C-train station.

Bud takes too long

Frequency is not enough at all times.

Right now there is only one bus stop near Yorkville community, which is at the edge of the whole community, it would be nice to have the bus stop closer to the center of the community.

My daughter needs this bus route for Centennial high school. I do not want her changing busses or doubling her journey times. Also, why is there not a dedicated bus for Centennial High School when we clearly live in the catchment area??

Teenagers attending their designated school in Sundance have a difficult time using transit as it's currently scheduled and the new schedule will make it more difficult. Additional buses that transport from Chaparral to Sundance in the morning and afternoon bells would encourage teen ridership. All Saint's high school is Legacy provides this service.

The current schedule drops off in Shawnessy before the train station which allows my teen to be able to take 178 and get to work in a reasonable time. The suggested schedule will more than double to triple his travel time so alternative solutions will probably be found.

Route 78 should be a dedicated Sundance Midnapore loop connecting to CTrain. Route 178 should be a dedicated Chaparral loop connecting to the CTrain.



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<p>It would be helpful if the 78 started earlier during the week (all year round) and on the weekends (at least during the summer months). Also, this bus is notoriously late so it would be helpful if you either got the drivers to be more diligent or changed the stop times. It's frustrating in the winter when you're already waiting 10 mins for the bus and you see it go by in the other direction (knowing you have another 10 minutes till it comes back to you). It would also be helpful if the 444 and 167 ran on the weekends. It would also be helpful if the 78, 444 and 167 bus times were spaced out a bit. Oftentimes they all come within minutes of each other (both in the community and at Somerset) and that's not helpful. I think the addition of Silverado to my proposed route will make the route longer. But it doesn't change the route where I go to my home (it still goes along Millrise Dr) so I think I'm ok. The service span became longer too than former route 15 so I think that's a positive (up until 12:30 am). I guess we'll just have to get used to the changes if the proposed route ever comes to pass.
Silverado route seems to stays the same.
More frequent buses
Don't mess with 402. Why make it go back to the old days of switching from 406/402. Just don't. Leave it as is; your drivers are always late anyways why make it worse?
Not meet because it seems the travel time will take longer it will not benefit most of the passenger if the route will take longer rather than spending less hour, for me it's not beneficial at all.
Route 102 will work for me less well than current Route 15. Increased frequency through Millrise will only run one way, because the proposal cancels service in the other direction. This means that living in Millrise, I'll be disconnected from Fish Creek station, which is closer to downtown than Shawnessy. Walking to either Shawnessy or Fish Creek station will become faster than waiting for the local bus, even with its faster frequencies, so my journey time between (for example) Millrise and UofC will go up more. I think that making this route a one-way loop will make every transit user in the Millrise/Shawnessy area less connected and push us further towards car dependency. That's why I'm strongly against the change.

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I like the new proposed route just would like to see it run later on the weekend. I sometimes work until 9:30pm and the route as it stands right now doesn't run late enough to get home so I either have to take a cab or walk.
Would like to see the bus still run to the fish creek station.
This makes it look like I'm going to have to wait longer than I already do to get to/from the train and then have to take the milk route through Somerset? If that's the case and I can't get to/from the train in the same amount of time or less than I already do then that's it and I'm done with transit. I already spend way too much of my day commuting to/from work and then have to deal with all the other safety issues and degenerates on the train and platforms I get on/off at together with regular service disruptions for various reasons that delay my commute. I was already on the fence so this will be the nail in the coffin for me and I'll eat the cost of driving to/from work and parking downtown. Stop messing with shit and just leave it alone. You want people to take transit, then stop making it less desirable.

Now with the new proposed route, the 15 would bypass Midnapore completely, leaving passengers to rely solely on the 52. And it should be noted that the 52 bus runs every 45 minutes weekdays and weekends. 45 minutes is too long a wait for the next bus, especially if the weather is bad.

The fifteen picks me up on Millrise blvd right in front of my building I am disabled and my condo complex and the neighbouring seniors home across the street from us will be really affected. I use this bus three nights a week at 10:18 and also home on my work nights and would use it more if this bus ran after nine on the weekends as I work weekends and have to pay for a taxi on those nights. I think what your proposing is wrong we may be close to fishcreek station but I don't feel safe at fishcreek station at night as I walk with a cane and you are isolated so i would lose a major life line to my ability to travel to and from work.
Increases my wait time for the bus. It would be more crowded on the bus and more convenient to walk the 30 minutes home than take the bus.
Does not meet my needs. The bus stop is too far away so I drive to the train station. You need to expand the route to at least 194 Ave. Silverado has grown since this route first started.
Still want to keep the 402 route
Frequency is a concern with this new proposed route, I am afraid that the current (fair) frequency will turn horrible with the route being this long.
Not clear where the stop is at C-Train and if pickup time will be the same
I think the proposed route 102 will improve my access to the shawnessy shopping centre area. Currently the 15 takes me all the way around shawnessy and midnapore to get me to Millrise from the shawnessy shopping centre area, and often times I find myself just taking the 15 in a overly long route when I have lots of heavy things to carry. I would hope to see some better frequency as well. As for the access to the lrt stations, I am happy to see that the bus still connects the community and my home to an lrt station (shawnessy in this case), but it does cut services to a more direct route from my place to fish creek station, which would have a minimal impact since I already live in a walking distance of both shawnessy and fish creek station. Overall, I think that the route change will positively impact my travel options, with having a more direct and frequent route to shawnessy shopping centre being the most important factor.



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<p>When choosing whether to take transit or drive to the station when heading north from the area, bus frequency on route 15 already pushes me to drive almost every time. But disconnecting it from Fish Creek station, which is closest to our community and closer to downtown, would discourage me even more. The proposed changes won't help car dependency in Millrise at all, and will just make it last longer in time. Making the city more accessible by transit and getting more people onto transit is important and needs to be the goal, and the proposed changes don't match that goal.</p>

The one annoying item I have encountered with the existing Silverado schedule is the weekend hours the bus first starts. It's selfish but I like to head out early for breakfast but the first Sunday bus is past 0700 so it forces me to take my car. That gap in service leads to another concern about people who work early and the cost they might encounter for cabs etc. More buses/trains will encourage the public to use the system, less along with too many restrictions can have a negative effect on rider usage.</p>

Insufficient information has been provided. The frequency of service, especially during the morning rush (0600-0700) is not indicated. Travel time is not indicated. The 402 route service remains significantly degraded in the morning rush following Covid.
The walking distance from Yorkville to the closest bus stop in Silverado is too far (especially in winter time) and would like to propose in extending the Silverado route to include 194 ave.
Before COVID the frequency was great. If frequency goes back to pre-COVID times, it will be perfect.
What I see at all hours is people walking from communities south of Silverado, Yorkville, Belmont, Sirocco, etc., to the bus stops in Silverado (we live across the street from a busy Silverado Bus Stop). Please expand the route of Legacy/Walden or Silverado to go through either from Sheriff King to Belmont are and back onto 194th or to cross over MacLeod Trl on 210 Ave to Belmont and back to Somerset LRT.
Silverado is very close to Yorkville, it would be great to extend the route to the community of Yorkville as it is not that far for the bus to drive thru Yorkville Boulevard and Avenue but a long walk for Yorkville residents to go to a bus stop in Silverado.
The nearest bus stop is 15 mins walk away in neighboring community. Also the frequency is 30 mins. So if missed have to walk near around an hour to the station.
Have to walk for 15 more mins into neighboring community to take a bus. If missed have to walk for around an hour or wait for 30 mins for the next bus. if the proposed route is approved it will be a long tour to reach home/station. which will be a long commute to reach to destination which already is long now withy the current route.

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I stay in Yorkville and need to walk to Silverado for my closest bus stop. Please extend this route to have bus stop on 194 Ave SW for shorter walking distance for Yorkville residents. Thank you.

As of now there is long wait time between 2 buses at Somerset LRT Station for Silverado. People have to wait 30 min if one bus is missed. Rather than increasing the frequency, if the route is made longer it will cause a lot of inconvenience. This will encourage people taking their personal vehicles causing a lot of traffic, parking issues and affect environment.

The new proposed 102 route would not work for me as it would not go near my closest urgent care centre the South Calgary Urgent Care and Walk-in and it would not go to the Fish Creek train station where I wait for a train home in the winter as it is the only train station near my home that has a heated building in the winter. The current wait time for the 15 route works well with the 52 route but if the 15 route were to be redone and moved then the wait time for a bus near my home that gets me to my work in the south would be up to 45 minutes of waiting. I need the 102 route to maintain the 15 route as that bus gets me to my work and school in Millrise, if the route were to change I would not be able to get to work on time or home safely in the winter. I need route 102 to stick to the the route 15 stops.



Unless you plan on increasing the frequency of how often the 52 bus comes, I see this proposed route 102 as a huge downgrade. I use both the 15 and 52 daily. Coming from the Red Line, I access both routes from both the Shawnessy and Fish Creek-Lacombe train stations, depending on when my phone tells me the next bus is. But in the winter I only access bus routes from the Fish Creek-Lacombe station because the building next to the bus stops provides much better shelter than anything at the Shawnessy station. I have an autoimmune disorder that means my body cannot properly regulate my body temperature, so there's only so much 'dressing for the weather' I can do. With no access to the 15/102 from the Fish Creek station, I'll be forced to rely solely on the 52 in the winter, meaning I may have to wait up to 45 mins for my next bus, or perhaps even longer, considering how unpredictable buses can be when the weather is bad. That is completely unacceptable. And none of this touches on the fact that LITERAL bus loads of kids use the 15 to get to Centennial High School every day (another example of how, if you guys are dead-set on angering tons of people and going through with this new proposed route, you NEED to increase the frequency of how often the 52 comes). Additionally, replacing the 15 with the 102 eliminates access to Urgent Care and the walk-in clinic in Midnapore where previously there was access. I don't think someone should be forced to walk a longer route or worse, simply not go, if they're in need of urgent care. And with provincial cuts to healthcare leaving many people without family doctors, removing this access to the walk-in clinic and other health services creates another barrier where people are already facing so many. This proposed route change is either poorly thought out or simply heartless and uncaring in the face of people who actually use Transit. The only ones who will experience 'increased efficiency' from these changes are Calgary Transit themselves, and that's not the point of public transportation, because public transport is supposed to serve the people. Please, do not go through with these changes. Scrap the proposed 102 and keep the 15 route.

Since the proposed bus route 102 will not be going to Fishcreek Station anymore.

Now EVERYONE will have to walk over to 210 Ave, which will add about an extra 10-20 min of our time. Why waste all that connectivity, utility, fare and overall devalue the bus itself by missing out on connecting 3 dense communities just so the buses in question can travel through Macleod and get to Walden and legacy faster? It just makes no sense. What if people in sundance need to get to legacy? Should they have to go all the way to the station on a bus, and then catch another bus? What about vice versa? 168 and 167 being limited service (essentially locking down an entire neighborhood of transit goers for certain periods) was bad enough, but this is beyond ridiculous
Currently times work. Proposal of midday and weekend trips is awesome
I hope the proposed changes on Route 167 as it's been really FRUSTRATING not have any bus services on the weekends or middays, especially for those who don't drive. It's very frustrating to be stuck in the area o probably get an Uber in order to leave the zone any days of the weekend or middays. I'm very looking forward to see it. Please go ahead.
No schedule during the day makes it difficult to travel to and from the Legacy community.
It's not fair that bus route along the Walden BLVD is removed.
The proposed route will meet my travel needs better that the existing one. I want to be able to get to downtown as quickly as possible on a week days. My kids will use the route on the weekends and evenings to take them to their sport activities.
Take longer to LRT station as well as limited frequency
It doesn't meet my needs to get out of the Legacy Community coz there's no Weekends and Holiday bus plus the facts that I need to run sometimes from train station to meet the last trip the bus have.



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there is no weekend bus route for 167/168 and i work. I would need to always walk to Walden and Chaparral intersection for route 78 bus every weekend. This proposal is fantastic

The most important for me is having weekend and evening service. Many people including workers who work past peak hours or university or high school students who may not have access to a vehicle are limited in their ability to access transit and therefore are isolated unless they walk late at night which can be dangerous or utilize taxis or uber's which are an added expense. Providing evening and weekend service is very much needed in this area. It would make quality of life better overall . I am very pleased with the proposal to add evening and weekend service even if I have farther to walk to get the bus or even if the trip is longer Its all something that is possible to plan around but having no service at night and weekends has been difficult to manage as a working person who commutes daily.

So important

Need more busses in evening times and weekends

The bus only comes during peak times in the day which makes it hard to make appointments or meetings when it is not peak time. It means I have to call a cab which is more expensive and I'd rather take the bus. I would love for some more busses to be added. Even if it was just one every hour during off peak times it would be helpful.

We need the transit service not to end so fast and we need transit on weekends

It's still quite far from where I live. I need to walk a fair distance to be able to catch the bus.

The 167 bus doesn't come mid-day on weekdays, or at all on weekends. That creates a big problem for me. During the hours it currently operates, it comes often enough. It is very handy for me to get to the nearby bus stop from my home. It is handy that this bus goes to the train station.

There is need for busses after 6:30pm, at least one more hour will be great.

We need earlier travel times for weekdays and weekends out of legacy and walden. Walking all the way into walden to get a bus is to much in the winter. A lot of people work and take transit. We need to have a bus that picks up at 5:30am & 6am and if we could have them run every 45mins/1hr during the slow times that would be awesome. I truly appreciate you reading this and I hope you have an awesome day!

this needs to have more busses and on weekends and off rush hour times.... there are no busses that service the Legacy or Walden are at all...some people have to walk at least 30 minutes to get to 194th to be able to get to the ctrain or shawnessy in a city this size its ridiculous that there is nothing



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Monday to Friday all day long bus service need in this area
Living by a bus stop I never see anyone waiting for the bus midday or on weekends. No need for increased service with zero customer base when the buses are already driving by with barely anyone on the bus
Legacy needs midday service transit services
The proposed bus route changes will not allow my 12 year old son to get to and from his designated school properly! this is unacceptable.
Its okay but I would like to be in a lot quicker when getting from my location to end stop which new proposal should cover
It needs more frequency
I find that it's not too frequent that we have buses within Walden. With a lot of people now, we need more bus times. I also think that they need to put more hours into the bus service because it ends early at night. Many are working late and don't have any buses to ride on going home.
It sucks. The bus should run at least once per hour. I've been calling for 4yrs requesting a change.
I really hope that the 167/168 will run regularly like the 78. It services such a large area and it's a shame it only runs a quarter of the time. Please make this happen
Currently there is no mid day service or weekend service which makes it exceedingly difficult to get to work, we don't all work Monday to Friday 9-5pm. The bus needs to run all day long and it need to run on the weekends as well. Currently the last bus from the train station runs until just after 6pm which is also ridiculous. The busses need to run until at least 10pm.
This route takes sundance high school students attending all saint high school I legacy directly to the school. The loss of this route would be extremely disruptive to school transit
Not having the route travel along Chaparral BV and Sun Valley BV is ridiculous. SO many kids in this community (Chaparral Valley, Lake, AND Ridge) take the bus to Centennial High School. The new route will add a ton of time to the commute for them which means they have to leave earlier and get home later. Would you consider adding an express route? It's bad enough they need to walk up the hill to get the bus (444 and this route never lined up well), now they'll need to walk further to ride the bus further. That bus was always PACKED with kids in both directions! This is 100% the wrong direction.
The route does not meet my needs. Would have to walk a fare amount in order to get a bus to where I need to go. There would no longer be an easy direct route from chaparral drive to All Saints High School in Legacy.

And as for the weekends i notice many people in the condos walking to the save on foods location to pick up the 78 and during winter that sucks so to have at least one route on the weekends would be a big help every 30 minutes or so, would help those, with work, appointments anybody wanting to just get out of the neighborhood and anyone at the front end that doesn't drive that wants to go to bed bath and beyond or Sobeys to get groceries but doesn't wish to walk.

While still keeping an eye out for the 168 if it did make its way.

My son uses this to get to school. It is critical

This route does not meet my travel needs because it starts from 6 AM to 9AM and then doesn't run until 3PM and only runs until 6PM so if you take the bus and you're out until after 9 you have to wait 6 hours until the next bus. This makes people have to make plans at around this time and if you miss the bus after 6PM you cannot get home unless you walk for over 2 hours. This is completely impractical. Make the bus times just like any bus going throughout the day and not end at 9AM and 6PM. a good example of times is the 14 Bridlewood route. This route goes throughout the whole day and doesn't stop until around 11PM. This is what the 167 route needs. The bus should be working throughout the whole day so that people don't have to mold their schedules and plans around these bus times.

No. I live in sundance and the 167 is perfect for getting to work in the morning. With changes to the 78/178, my travel time is heavily impacted.
The proposed changes make no sense at all and will cause a great deal of difficulty to many people, especially junior and senior high school students who would lose a direct route along chaparral Blvd and Sunvalley Blvd and need to go Silverado which is beyond inconvenient. It's not a matter of adding a few minutes longer to the commute, but a substantial amount of time.. This impacts people's quality of life. And also, since there is only one bus I'll be stuck till next one comes, where right now there is a safety net with 167 and 168, so if I miss one, I can wait for 5-10 mins and get into another one. And with you guys switching bus drivers around makes this safety net very viable, since different drivers arrive at different times. What you are proposing makes no sense, except "saving" questionable amount of money. We pay enough in new communities to have access to somewhat reliable transit, and you simply suggest to take that away - can't agree with this change.

I depend on the bus to get me to the train station Mon-Fri for work, but I am unable to work stat holidays due to no bus service, also cannot stay out after work as this service stops around 7pm which is ridiculous for such a large new communitiee.

You cant possibly be thinking of cutting the service that we have... That's the most stupid thing I've heard, You should be improving this service to a growing community, do you really expect people to walk from Walden gate in the winter?? Only some desk jockey who doesn't use transit would come up with such a ridiculous idea. look at spacing the 167 and 168 routes out during the day not cutting service.

There is no service during the mid-day, only during late afternoon or early mornings causing me and others having to walk to Chaparral to use a bus, which is a 40 minute walk. Having a longer service time would be great!

If there is a service between 6am to 10pm it should meet all passengers demand, it doesn't matter the travel time, because we need a ride. The propose frequency time added will a big impact.

Need to add weekend service to Walden/Legacy

Its about time we have a more frequent shuttle at the Leagcy/Walden community. Its hard getting to your desired destination once the bus stops running, its even harder on weekends and stat holidays. So this is a more than welcome development in our community. I can only wish the 2 buses 167 and 168 keep running more frequently inclusive of weekends and stat. Having just 167 ply the route might increase the wait times to get on the bus. I like how they run klokwise and anticlockwise.

there was no bus service after rush hour neither on weekend which made people very inconvenient when we don't have car!!

I have a client in Legacy who is waiting for the bus to improve so I am able to travel freely to her home. The current bus does not meet my needs to reach her home.



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For the 168/167 routes, the running time being only during rush hour and not available on weekends is a major inconvenience and makes it incredibly difficult to leave the neighborhood on the weekends and any other time that's not Monday-Friday rush hour. What happens to all the people using the transit system on the weekends? How are they expected to get around? Because as of the current times, they have to walk over 40mins to get to any form of running transit on a Saturday or Sunday. Which is a very large deterrent to leave the house for those with walking difficulties etc. Even if the time is changed so that the route runs the normal transit schedule (4-5amish to at least 9-10pmish) 7 days a week. The frequency is frustrating because of the times that the route stops running midday, if you miss your first bus....if another is coming (big if) than you're waiting at least an hour. I understand that it is a newer development but the ability to get around anywhere past Somerset Train Station is just going to become harder and harder when more people can't access transit. Unfortunately wanting to improve/increase ridership is not going to be very feasible until people can actually access the transit system and feel that it's something they can reliably use all days of the week. Thank you.

The proposed route 167 is perfect.

I would suggest the route travel two-way along Walden Dr., then Legacy Blvd, Legacy Main, then Legacy Cir, with a turnaround at the last roundabout to the south in that community. This provides more simple service and equal travel time regardless of where a rider gets on or off the route.

Currently there's no service during the day, weekend or after 7 pm

Meet

There is little demand during peak service times on 167 so adding all day week day service and weekend service is a total waste of financial and finite resources. I live on this bus route and its net benefit to the few people that use it for school or work has no relevance to a week end service. That was tried by the Transit authority on 167 and 168 and abandoned several years ago. Use Uber for off peak and week end service it makes financial sense and environmental sense to stop the diesel particulates impacting out community from these outdated machines being used Monday to Friday.

Weekend and mid day schedules are needed!

This bus meets my needs because it runs on weekends and in the middle of the day. However it still doesn't run as long as the 78 or close to as long and that makes it take longer to get home past 7pm

No bus between 9am-3pm

There are no busses on weekends and during the middle of the day.

There is no service on weekends or midday.

No busses at a lot of times in the day



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All of those statements matter. I'm happy I can no get to where I need to go outside of the minimal hours that route currently operates
Nearly. Given the large number of residents in walden and legacy that don't work 9 to 5 but work through the night, very early in the morning, or very late at night, a 7 pm stop time doesn't help many. Otherwise, the improvement are good.
The current 167/168 route does not include midday and weekend service, as well as ending very early on weeknights. This current schedule is very ineffective and due to the growing population and amount of business growing in the Walden and Legacy areas. This has been a problem since the beginning of the bus service and it should be fixed immediately!
167 is the only bus that isn't a 20 minute walk away from my house, it would be so much better if it spanned longer in the day and ran on the weekends.
Maybe not just a morning and evening .
I don't drive so I normally have to car pool or grab a cab and having a transit service here in the area would be great....
The route is capable of bringing me to the destination at an appropriate time. However, buses do not run during the weekend, which requires me to have to walk to a nearby 78 route bus stop, which takes 18-20mins.
Hours of service are currently very limited. I use bus for work in retail and do not have a car. Current service doesn't meet my needs for for mid day work shifts or getting home after 7pm. I have no way to get to work on weekends at all. I don't know the hours of new service on weekdays or weekends. Hopefully the new changes will be significantly expanded hours of service throughout days, including weekends. We really need this. Thank you.
Buses 167/168 do not run during midday hours and on weekends, this hinders my ability to get to and from work, requiring me to take an Uber or get my mom to drive me. I don't think the biggest problem is the route but instead the limited time the route runs.
There are not enough busses throughout the day
Frequency of the bus during off peak hours is important to me, especially I work shifting hours. 45 mins interval will be a long wait, even more during winter season. Plus travel time is very long after 7pm. After a long day at work we want to get home early if possible so we can rest.
Makes it worse, I live right by chapparal Blvd and take the 167 and 168. According to this there will be no bus along the Blvd. It's a much longer walk to the 78 for me

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I need to get to high school, and the bus route was previously my only ride to school.
