




Snow Detour Routes:

Some buses may go a different route when it snows. These orange signs help show which stops might be closed during a snow detour.

Dress for the weather:




Check the weather forecast and wear the proper clothes and footwear whether it's hot or cold!



Snow clearing:

Snow is cleared when there's around 2 cm, then about once every 24 hours until it's done.



A plan is in place to make sure snow is cleared safely and as quickly as possible.





Crews have a lot to clear like CTrain and MAX stations, pedestrian bridges, Be careful of ice patches and bus loops, parking lots, snowbanks on sidewalks and around bus stops and bus stops.

Transit Ambassadors are based at CTrain stations, and are always happy to answer any transit-related question!


Some things they can help with are:
